**Did you know...?** Students can ride free on many transit providers throughout Southern California. Here's how:

# Metrolink

Metrolink is extending its Student Adventure Pass program through June 30, 2025.

The pass allows anyone with a valid student ID—including K-12, trade school, college students and student interns—to travel anywhere on the Metrolink system free of charge.

# Transit Discounts for the Slightly Older Crowd...

If you are aged 60 or older, you may qualify for a special senior discount rate on area bus and rail (proof of age is typically required).

On Metro, for example, the rate for riders aged 62 or older with a **Senior TAP Card** is just 75 cents (peak hours) and 35 cents (off peak). Tupical cash fare is \$1.75.

OC Bus discounts are available to riders 60 and older.

Senior fares are also available from transit providers in Riverside,

San Bernardino and Ventura counties.

Contact your local transit provider to learn if you qualify and to sign up for senior discount fares.
